Cristina Chaminade is a full professor in Innovation Studies at Lund University (Sweden) and Adjunct Professor at Aalborg University (Denmark). She is also affiliated to CIRCLE and the Lund University Center for Sustainability (LUCSUS). She holds a bachelor and doctoral degree in Economics (with a major in Development Economics) from the Autonomous University of Madrid (UAM). Her PhD included a 2-year stay at the University of Sao Paulo (Brazil)- Faculdade de Economia e Administracao (FEA-USP). Her thesis was awarded Best thesis in Economics 1998-1999. She has complemented her formation with courses on Ecological Economics (Environmental Europe, Oxford) and in Sustainability Science (Stockholm University).

Her research interests lay in the intersection between innovation studies, development studies and sustainability. The focus of her research is on global networks and the processes of knowledge creation and adoption that underpin innovations and the transformations towards sustainable forms of living (economic, social and environmental) and how they are affected and affect institutions.

She has actively worked on innovation in developing countries such as China, India, South Africa, Thailand, and Brazil for over 15 years. She's been an advisor to international organizations such as the European Commission, UNCTAD, OECD and UN-ECLAC. She has published in international journals, refereed books and handbooks in the fields of innovation, development studies and knowledge management such as Research Policy, Industry and Innovation, Innovation and Development and European Planning Studies. She is Editor of the Journal of Innovation and Development, the International Journal of Innovation and the Journal of Sustainability Research. She is an elected Board member of Globelics- the global network for Economics of learning, innovation and competence building systems since 2017.

She is the Director of the Master in Innovation and Global Sustainable Development at the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Lund University and main responsible for the courses on Innovation for sustainable development, Globalization of Innovation and Economics of Innovation.
